May 11, 2021 - Competition Results


The May Competition **Oldies** allowed any images to be entered regardless of when they were made.



2021-2022 Competition Themes

Each year NVPS hold three themed competitions to focus and challenge members. The themes the NVPS 2021-2022 calendar year are described below. Keep the themes in mind as you photograph in the coming months.

- **Flowers:** They are everywhere, in your backyard, your neighbor's back yard, florist bouquets, on trees, botanical gardens, roadsides, florist bouquets, wild and/or cultivated. So, show us your best shots! The subject must be actively flowering, from a single bloom or part thereof, to an entire field or fields. Be creative! Montages, multiple exposures, zooming, panning, focus stacking, etc., are all allowed, so long as the photographer has created all parts of the picture, and it meets the theme. Seedpods or tight buds are not allowed, unless they are an insignificant part of the image, or serve to enhance the subject.
- Old: People, places, or objects that are showing their age. Helpful definitions: 1. Having lived for a long time; no longer young. 2. Made or built long ago. The hands, eyes, faces of older people are classic examples. Dilapidated barns, antique cars or trucks are good examples. No dead, or dying flowers or plants; in their relative life span they are old but it defeats the purpose of this theme.
- <u>Abstracts:</u> An abstract photograph may isolate a fragment of a natural scene in order to remove its inherent context from the viewer, it may be purposely staged to create a seemingly unreal appearance from real objects, or it may involve the use of color, light, shadow, texture, shape and/or form to convey a feeling, sensation or impression. Close ups of common objects, reflections on moving water are some examples. Generally, the subject is not readily identifiable. "Basic" post processing is allowed. Software add-ins and tools such as liquify, textures, etc. are not allowed. Stacking multiple images, zooming, and panning done by the photographer are permitted. This theme is about what the photographer can accomplish in camera not about processing with software tools.

Field Trips

June 12, 2021 - Shenandoah

The drive to the Big Meadows inside Shenandoah National Park from Fairfax is just over two hours. This area has been chosen for its wildlife, landscapes, waterfalls and other diverse nature photography opportunities. It also happens to be one of the best destinations we can occupy to avoid covid.

June is a particularly fortunate time as the fawns should be out frolicking with mamma doe. The trails surrounding Big Meadows campgrounds have also frequently reported black bears. The nearby waterfalls may not have as strong a flow, but they should also provide unique opportunities for those who are looking for a hike to go with their photography. Others will find many opportunities to pull off the side of Skyline Drive to find inspirations a few hundred feet from the side of the road. (Skyline Drive is about 106 miles long and takes about 3 hours to drive. Add in frequent stops and you're looking at a better part of a full day of shooting.)

The Shenandoah Valley also makes for a spectacular subject should conditions present themselves for a sunset shot or nighttime astro-photography. In fact, this field trip offers so much to photograph that you might just want to include an overnight stay at the Big Meadows Lodge or at a nearby accommodation.

Big Meadows Lodge

Note: new <u>COVID cancellation policies</u> include no-charge cancellations "by 4:00 pm EDT 2 days before the scheduled arrival date."

What:

As mentioned above, this destination is abundant in all things wild, from wildlife to wildflowers. On June 12 (or June 13 in case of rain), we'll meet in the afternoon at the Harry F. Byrd Visitor Center to plan our late afternoon photography activities. From there, we'll decide if it's best to trek the Big Meadows loop trail across the road for deer, explore the campground trails for bears, or start the landscape hunt early. We've timed this field trip in hopes of capturing the fawns and cubs that inhabit the Big Meadows area, but there are opportunities for other nature inspired photography you may not want to miss.

Sunrise is expected at 5:49 AM (EDT)

Sunset is expected at 8:38 PM (EDT)

The Milky Way will be visible for most of the night.

The Moon will be in a Waxing Crescent Phase (4%, New moon on June 10) https://www.moongiant.com/calendar/june/2021/

Equipment:

- Any lens between 18-200mm will satisfy most landscape needs. For wildlife captures as 300+mm lens is recommended
- Astro-photographers should bring fast wide angle lenses (f5.6 is okay, F/4 is better and f/208 even better)
- A polarizer filter may come in handy. Bring your other neutral density filters and graduated filters to help balance your exposures
- Don't forget a spare battery and memory card(s)
- Bring a light jacket for higher altitude temperatures and comfortable shoes
- Bring a mask and some personal hand sanitizer

Remember, fuel is available near the visitor center but it can be a bit expensive. Be sure to fuel up prior to entering the park as there are only three gas stations along the drive (milepost 24, 51 and 79).

When:

Saturday, June 12, 2021 from 3pm to 8pm. Rain date is Sunday June 13, 2021 from 3pm to 8pm

Where:

We will meet outside the Harry F. Byrd Visitor Center (main parking lot) at 3pm for a meet and greet. We'll also discuss the conditions and review plans for the late afternoon and evening.

Rangers from 9am to 5pm will staff the visitor center outside. The building itself is not expected to be open. Restrooms are to be open at the visitor center.


Parking is free at the visitor center. However, Shenandoah National Park charges a fee to enter:

- \$30 per car provides unlimited entry for the vehicle and all passengers for the next seven days
- \$0 if you have a Shenandoah Annual Pass or America the beautiful Pass (aka, Interagency pass)

NVPS July 2021 Field Trip

July 10, 2021 - Kenilworth Aquatic Gardens

We're back with this club favorite, Kenilworth Aquatic Gardens. NVPS frequently visits this destination at this time of year because the lotus flowers and water lillies are in bloom. If you haven't got your flower shot for next season's themed competition, here is a great opportunity. If you're not into flowers, consider the opportunities to capture images of dragon flies, birds, turtles, frogs, and more.

What:

Kenilworth Aquatic Gardens is home to heron, birds, dragon flies, and amphibians. You'll also notice the rather obvious shallow ponds filled with lotus and water lillies.

You're welcome to wander along the paths that separate the ponds in search of your next image. When you're done with the lotus and lillies, you can take the boardwark at the far end of the park out to a viewing platform where along the way you can typically find herons and other birds.

This is a very popular destination at this time of year. Please be patient and locate your subjects while maintaining social distancing from other photographers. The National Park Service warns that if the park becomes too crowded they may temporarily close the park gates to limit people on site.

Sunrise is expected at 5:52 a.m. (EDT)

Equipment:

- Any lens between 24-200mm will satisfy most needs. Those with an interest in birding may want to bring a lens with 300+mm range. A macro lens may also come in handy if you are interested in dragon flies.
- Don't forget your polarizer and diffuser/reflector.
- Tripods are allowed everywhere.
- Bring a mask, the National Park Service requires them.
- Bug/tick spray and sunscreen.
- Water. The weather is expected to be very hot and humid.

When:

Saturday, July 10, 2021 from 8am - 11am Rain date on Sunday, July 11, 2021 from 8am - 11am

Where:

We'll meet in the parking lot to share any updated news. It's only a couple minutes walk to the gardens.

Please note, the visitor center, restrooms, and water fountain will be closed. There will be porta potties.
