Welcome to the November FotoFax.

I'm John Nash, serving as the assistant editor this month while our regular editor, Judy Guenther, takes some time off.

In this issue, you'll find the usual departments highlighting opportunities for member involvement in many aspects of photography that include member presentations, special speakers and

Like many of you, photography has long been a part of my life. I recall receiving one of those square Kodak Brownie cameras as a kid and carefully taking pictures as developing film was an expense in those days. That camera almost cost me my life or serious maiming when I aimed it at my sister with her hair in rollers or whatever girls rolled their hair around including cans! I took that camera to my summer church camp where it survived dropping, falling in a stream, and a brief game of football. I so wish I had some of those blurry black-and-white photos that showed a rag-tag group of boys standing on a waterfall, none smiling as though the picture was painful.

Later in college, I took a photo class that required developing my own negatives. I recall the

professor gave me high marks for a picture that included a curving wall with a reluctant roommate studiously posed. I never told the professor that the leading lines were happenstance as I had to get the picture fast before my roommate rebelled.

I continued my photography during my military career, now shooting 35mm slides and black-and-white film (cheaper). I probably have some very interesting negatives from many years ago when I was stationed in Germany and Thailand.



Then came digital photography and almost overnight that made taking pictures fun and easy since everyone could keep and print only the "good" photos. I put "good" in quotation marks as most of my pictures complied with "beauty is in the eyes of the beholder." It wasn't until I began to get good digital cameras, started reading books, watching Youtube clips, and participating in some photo clubs that I began to learn what makes a good photograph and how I could actually improve my photography.

I've only been a member of NVPS for a year but during this time, I feel I've learned a lot by seeing what accomplished photographers have done and learning from speakers, judges, and presentations. Learning is always good but when it is fun......it is better! I look forward to years ahead in NVPS, learning, having fun, and hopefully, improving my photography.

November 2, 2021 – Richard Bernabe – *The Six Principles of Art for Photographers*



Richard Bernabe is an internationally-renowned nature, wildlife, and travel photographer as well as widely-published author from the United States. His passion for adventure has been the driving force behind his life's quest to capture the moods and character of the world's most amazing places, from Africa to the Amazon to the Arctic and countless places in between.

Editorial clients include National Geographic, The New York Times, Time, Audubon, The BBC, The World Wildlife Fund, National Parks, Outdoor Photographer, and many others.

Corporate clients include Canon, Patagonia, Orvis, REI, Apple, Microsoft, American Express, and more.

Richard was named one of the "Top 30 Influential Photographers on the Web" by

the Huffington Post and included in the "20 Photographers Changing the World Through Social Media" by Influence Digest. Richard is a global influencer in the fields of photography, travel, and wildlife conservation with more than one million social media followers. More at https://richardbernabe.com



For his presentation this evening titled, *The Six Principles of Art for Photographers*,

Richard will answer the following question, "What's the secret to improving your nature, wildlife, or travel photos?"

Richard says that you can better hone your composition skills, develop a keener eye for natural light, and express your moments in nature in more emotional tones and you will certainly create more compelling images. You could also learn from the design principles used by master painters and artists through the centuries in creating their timeless masterpieces. These Six Principles of Art (sometimes listed as Principles of Design and/or contain as many seven or even eight components) are the guiding precepts in what makes art and design more aesthetically pleasing to the human eye and brain Richard will discuss each of these principles and teach you how to apply them to your photography. National Geographic staff photographer since 1990, Mark Thiessen has published numerous feature stories and covers for National Geographic magazine and other National Geographic publications on subjects ranging from Peruvian mummies to the study of human performance



Education & Training

November 9, 2021 – Bill Millhouser and Stan Bysshe – *Anonymous Critique*

The month of November has five Tuesdays and therefore will have TWO E&T presentations. The first will be the popular *Anonymus Critique* with two of our club's seasoned experts, Bill Millhouser and Stan Bysshe. The second will be Bob & Willa Friedman speaking on *Street Photography*.



Bill became interested in photography in the early 1970s, starting with a used Yashica SLR moving on to a series of Canon film SLRs. In 2001 Bill dove into the digital age and bought the Canon D30 which had a rather modest 3.25-megapixel sensor and a blazing 3 FPS frame rate. Soon after retiring in 2010, Bill attended his first photographic workshop in Costa Rica, which exposed him to the wonderful variety and color of tropical birds and the proper use of big telephoto lenses (both on a tripod and handheld),

the use of fill-flash, and the complexities of multi-flash setups to capture the beauty of the region's many hummingbirds. His keen interest in wildlife and bird photography has since led him to visit locations throughout the Mid-Atlantic region, the West Coast, New Mexico, Florida, Belize, Central and South America, as well as several trips to Africa.

Since joining NVPS, Bill has served as the Field Trip Coordinator, Co-VP of competition, and President of the Club.

Stan's photographic journey started in the 1960s with a hand me down Nikkormat. But because of his love for scuba diving and marine tropical reef ecology, his equipment and images became dedicated to underwater nature. By 2010 it was time to hang up the fins and when he joined NVPS, Stan was exposed to a whole new world of land-based photography. Still nature remained a driving force behind his images.



Since joining the club, Stan has volunteered for Field Trips (twice), Competitions, Mentoring and is a past President. For the past several years he has helped lead photo tours in Washington State, Alaska, and Yellowstone National Park.

This is his second Anonymous Critique, and like most NVPS members, he too is still searching for that magic image recipe that captures the viewer's eye.

November 30, 2021 – Bob & Willa Friedman – *Street Photography*

As a teenager Bob started his photographic journey with a darkroom in his parent's



basement which he inherited from his brother. The first thing Bob & Willa did when they bought their house was to build a darkroom in the basement.

Willa first became involved in photography as an instructor at the American Museum of Natural History in New York, where she photographed wildlife in city parks for the NYC schools, and her images were published in a fourth-grade textbook.

If selling a few photos makes us pros, then we are pros. Otherwise we are advanced amateurs. We have taken courses and workshops at Photoworks at Glen Echo and with Freeman Patterson and Andre Gallant in New Brunswick, Canada. We have also had extensive courses in Photoshop. We have been members of NVPS for 12 years.

Our subjects are varied, but Bob does street photography and Willa finds reflections everywhere. Both use Fuji cameras with various lenses.



Our current job is retirement – it doesn't pay very well but it is a lot more fun than the



"W" word. We have multiple images in the Ralph Rinzler Folklife Archives and Collections at the Smithsonian Institution, Washington, DC, and have prints on display in various professional offices in the Metro DC area and in many private collections. We are also members of The Art League at the Torpedo Factory in Old Town, Alexandria.


This is a re-do of our presentation in 2018. Even though we were in the middle of the pandemic in the last several months, there were still lots of photographic possibilities.

Wikipedia says, "**Street photography** is photography conducted for art or inquiry that features unmediated chance encounters and random incidents within public places". We have been doing that for a number of years. The key word in the definition is "public"; it need not literally be on the street.

Our presentation will explain what you can do legally in public spaces as told by lawyers and court decisions. You do have the right to photograph in public places.

The "decisive moment" will be explored as shown by Henri Cartier-Bresson and other photographers, famous, not so famous, and us! It's not always what it seems.

Also, getting over the reluctance to take street photos or fear of getting punched in the face will be discussed, including safe and friendly places for street photography. There are interesting places where you can practice street photography, sometimes even with the cooperation of your subjects.

Ginger is a long-time member of NVPS and has served in several leadership roles, working with Education & Training and


serving as co-



In Wayne's presentation *The Best of Iceland in a Day* he will illustrate how amazing photographic results in Iceland can be achieved on a budget, including time constraints, when the planning and execution are done to maximize Iceland's photographic richness. His scenes of rugged coastlines, waterfalls and glaciers, to cityscapes including the streets in Reykjavik, will illustrate some of

the best of Iceland. Only one day and

two nights based on research, a few phone calls to Iceland, and careful planning led to wonderful results for Wayne while just using one camera and lens.

Wayne, an ecologist-naturalist, educator and nature photographer by professional education and passion, integrates all aspects of his background in his work, and




Willing Warriors Retreat Visit

Field Trips


Your NVPS Field Trip Coordinators Rena Schild and Steven Glintz have scheduled exciting field trips for this fall. Field trips are an excellent way to experience taking photographs in enticing places in a social environment with fellow NVPS members. They are also a great way to expand your photographic process knowledge and practice, often with the help of other members. A goal of NVPS is to help members learn and experience the joy of photography, and field trips offer many opportunities.

November 13 - Harper's Ferry (rain date November 14)

Many parts of West Virginia peak their fall colors in the first few weeks of October. We'll be visiting Harper's Ferry after what would be considered peak season, but that's okay. The sun will be lower in the sky and that can help accentuate textures and create interesting light and shadows in and around town. This field trip may be a black and white photographer's bread and butter, so to speak.

What:

Architecture photographers may find St. Peter's Roman Catholic Church interesting. The church appears to be open now so feel free to go inside. Landscape photographers may find sweeping vista shots from locations higher up like Jefferson Rock. Those same photographers looking for

more of a workout may try for the Maryland Heights trail (accessible via B&O Railroad Bridge) which takes you to a commanding view of the town. The trail takes a few hours to complete, but it can be rewarding. Of course, there's all the alley ways and nooks and crannies around the downtown area. There are lots of attractions just outside town as well including Piney Run Waterfall at Potoma Wayside Park so consider snooping around the area before you leave for the day. For this field trip, we'll concentrate around downtown.

Sunrise 6:52 a.m. (EST) Sunset 4:58 p.m. (EST)

Equipment:

- 24-70mm is my favorite walk about lens and will serve you well in these conditions.
- 70-200mm is another favorite for landscapes, candid street photography, and detail shots.
- Tripods are welcome
- Bring a mask if you plan to use the shuttle or go into any buildings. You can bring water or buy a bottle from a shop.

Where:

We'll gather at Arsenal Square at 9:30am. The drive from Alexandria to Harper's Ferry is about 80 minutes by way of I-495, I-270, and Rt.340.

Unlike many other parks operated by the National Park Service, Harper's Ferry has an entrance fee of \$20 per car (\$10 per individual). You can also get in with a Harpers Ferry Annual Pass (\$35) or an Annual (aka inter-agency) Park Pass (\$80, with discounts for Seniors and Military).




Ed Short – "Mieke Noe'Lani Foal"




