

December 14, 2021 – Judy Guenther – *What to "See" in Architecture*

Judy Guenther admits to being primarily a travel photographer. She loves shooting a variety of subjects while traveling, depending on where in the world she happens to be. From landscapes in the Palouse and National Parks, to water and ice in Greenland and Antarctica, to wildlife in South Georgia Island and Montana, to local portraits and street photography, and finally to her favorite subject of architecture. She didn't start shooting anything other than snapshots until 10 years ago when her husband, Wayne, decided she was ready for a "big girl's camera." She has moved from all-

Nikon equipment to Olympus mirrorless cameras. She also loves using the cameras on her iPhone 12 Pro Max. She has been a member of NVPS since 2015, is a member of the F11 Women's Photography Collective, the Art League in the Torpedo Factory in Old Town Alexandria, and the Maryland Federation of Arts in Annapolis, MD. She has received several awards including at the Nature Visions Expos (now Mid-Atlantic Photo Visions) the People's Choice Award in Photo Art and Best in Flower Photography in the Nature Category.

Judy will discuss her passion for architectural photography including some challenges, edit tips, and how to really "work" an architectural subject beyond the full building capture by delving into lines, patterns, graphics, reflections, and abstracts. The creative possibilities you can "see" are endless!

Field Trips

Get in the Holiday spirit by joining the December field trip to photograph the Capitol Hill Christmas Tree. Your NVPS Field Trip Coordinators Rena Schild and Steven Glintz are on a roll this year finding great places to photograph and to have contact again with your fellow NVPS photographers. Field trips are a great way to expand your photographic process knowledge and practice, often with the help of other members. A goal of NVPS is to help members learn and experience the joy of photography, and field trips offer many opportunities.

December 11, 2021 - Capitol Hill Christmas Tree (rain date December 12)

There's nothing like getting into the holiday spirit than visiting a giant tree decorated with lights. In December we'll visit the Capitol Hill Christmas Tree and surrounding area for an evening of





photographic creativity. There will be urban landscapes, architecture, light painting and more. The monuments on the East side of the Mall are great at night.

What:

The Capitol Dome and Christmas tree will be our primary subjects, however, there are lots of goodies around Capitol Hill so feel free to explore the area. The US Botanical Garden will also have its own outdoor holiday display (see <u>Plan Your Visit</u>) that will be open until 5pm. And don't forget about the East side of the Capitol Dome. If it's a wet evening, you'll likely find interesting (and fun) puddles on the pavement in front of the East side of the Capitol. Across 1st St. you have both the Library of Congress and Supreme Court for even more subjects. If the Capitol Dome is your thing, maybe also check out the Upper and Lower Senate Park and look South for the dome. There's lots to see and do.

Sunset: 4:47 p.m. (EST)

Equipment:

- Most any lens with a range of 24-200mm will serve you well, but other ranges will also work if you want to bring more glass. Maybe leave the super telephoto at home. You don't want to attract too much attention.
- Generally speaking, Capitol police won't allow tripods except on the land around the Christmas tree. National Park police are more forgiving. If things are busy at the outdoor botanical garden display, don't be surprised if someone asks you not to use a tripod. Politely accept their request and consider it permission to be more creative.


Mike Whalen - "Family Making Bread in Ghana"








Joseph Miller Abstract Exhibit

The Joseph Miller Center for the Photographic Arts once again takes enormous pride in announcing its TWELFTH ANNUAL juried abstract exhibit for May 2022. All interested photographers are invited to submit entries for this much anticipated spring event. In May 2020, because of restrictions imposed by the Covid pandemic, rather than cancelling what would have been our special Tenth "Anniversary" Exhibit at the JM Center, we went VIRTUAL. This year's Eleventh Annual Exhibit May 2021 not only became our second virtual exhibit but turned out to be one of our largest in terms of number of entries, and the general consensus was that it was possibly our strongest in terms of creativity. The upcoming 2022 Annual Exhibit will also be a Virtual **One.** The past 11 Annual Joseph Miller Exhibits have not only played a major role in the current popularity of abstracts locally but have exerted an unequivocal influence on the inclusion of abstract photography within the larger photographic community. The outstanding reputation of the Joseph Miller Abstract Exhibits over the last eleven years has also attracted entries from international and national photographic artists, in addition to the many local participants who come from the Greater Washington/Northern Virginia area or are non-affiliated/independent photographic artists.

The Joseph Miller Center will begin accepting entries for the upcoming TWELFTH ANNUAL EXHIBIT on **Sunday, December 26, 2021**.

The deadline for submissions will be **Saturday, February 26, 2022**.

The show will run from Saturday May 1, 2022 through Monday May 31, 2022.
