From the Editor

So now that the new year has started, and you may have photographed our huge January snowstorm, how will you decide to post process your work?

The world of photographic post processing has exploded over the last few years. There are so many software packages to use – the Nik collection by DXO; Topaz Studio 2 and all of its standalone packages like Topaz DeNoise and Sharpen; Skylum's Artificial Intelligence (AI) Luminar; ON1 Photo Raw and its standalone and plug-in apps; Adobe Lightroom; Photoshop's many tools including their Sensei AI filters;

and more. It can be mind-numbing, and intimidating trying to learn and use these software programs to take your photography to the next level.

I thought it might be interesting to see what some of our NVPS members' favorite post-processing methods, software, and instructors are. I'm sure many of us use more than one method in our individual workflow. I encourage you to write a short article for FotoFax to share the methods you use and why.

I'll start by saying that when I started getting interested in photography about 10 years ago, I didn't have a clue about post-processing. Just opening an image in Photoshop brought me to tears of frustration. But now my workflow takes me from Adobe Lightroom for basic adjustments into Photoshop for preliminary clean-up, then into Topaz DeNoise (if needed), then to ON1 Photo Effects, back to Photoshop, and final artistic effects with plug-in panels by Blake Rudis. I started following Blake Rudis when he ran instruction on a website called "HDR Insider" in 2015. He made my brain explode with his Zone Systems methodology. But I've stuck with him, and now he provides YouTube videos and has a website called "F64 Elite" which is so enlightening. He has many photo processing courses on his website and in addition has a monthly "Photo Challenge" for his members for which he provides an insightful review. I find his twice-monthly member image critiques (12 images each) especially helpful, just as I find the judge's comments on our NVPS monthly competitions helpful. Blake majored in painting in college and then morphed into his love of photography. Yet, he postprocesses his images with an artistic vision that I find very helpful and enriching. Blake's website is Blake Rudis F64 Elite. Jesús Ramirez at Photoshop Training Channel also provides amazing YouTube training videos on various aspects of using Photoshop.

Now, what software do you use or who do you follow – and will YOU share?

We welcome back frequent NVPS judge and speaker Roy Sewell to present February's Program.

February 1, 2022 - Roy Sewell - Visual Weight



Roy Sewell

Roy Sewall is a retired professional photographer based in Bethesda, MD. His interest in photography evolved from travel in six continents, yet he found his own community to be one of the most photogenic locations in the world.

From 2001 to 2009 Roy concentrated on capturing scenes of the Potomac River and the adjacent Chesapeake and Ohio (C&O) Canal. He then developed diverse bodies of work including foreign and domestic destinations, architecture and design, people, nature,

old places and things, and abstracts. He then moved on to a project called "*Mysterra*" - illusions that convey fantasy, whimsy, and spirits. Today his interests are quite broad. Roy has done extensive work for private and commercial clients, as well as for Potomac River and C&O Canal-related government and non-profit organizations.

Roy considers the ultimate destination for a photograph to be a large fine art print, 12" x 18" or larger. He has exhibited in numerous DC-area group and one-person shows, as well as in his own studio.

Roy's first photography coffee-table book, *Our Potomac, from Great Falls through Washington, D.C.*, was published in 2005. The book led to numerous lecture and slide show engagements with local organizations, and established him as one of the leading

photographers of the Potomac River and C&O Canal. His second book published in 2009, *Great Falls and Mather Gorge*, took a magnifying glass to this extraordinary area. These are still considered to be the definitive photography books of the river and canal in the DC area.

Roy offers both private and group instruction and critiques to novice and intermediate photographers. In 2014 he became an instructor for the Capital Photography Center where he offers classes and local field trips.

Roy has judged photographic competitions and has critiqued bodies of work in Maryland, DC, and Virginia camera clubs more than 70 times since 2006. He regularly presents instructional programs at camera clubs and Mid-Atlantic Photo Visions in Manassas, Virginia, with the most popular one being "Taking Your Photography to the Next Level."

He has made over 40 presentations to the general public about the Potomac River and C&O Canal using photographs from his two books. He has also presented photographs of China from 1901 to 1939

by his missionary grandfather, Robert Fitch, to Chinese and U.S. audiences.

In 2018, Roy was selected by the Maryland Photography Alliance to conduct their Judges Training Program, a three-session program each fall and spring. He served as the President of the North Bethesda Camera Club from 2016 to 2018. He was the first Chair of the Board of Directors of the C&O Canal Trust, and also served on the Board of Directors for the Potomac Riverkeeper Network.

Roy will discuss the various types of visual weight in an image: the size of an object, location, brightness, sharpness, contrast, warm colors, and saturation, and how visual weights affect the photo's balance and can drive the viewer's eyes to where you want them to look. Robert Rodriguez, Jr. is a landscape photographer, educator, and author focused on conveying the beauty and presence he experiences in nature. He is passionate about helping others discover their innate creativity. Robert graduated from the Berklee College of Music and was a music producer for 15 years before transitioning to photography where he continues to explore qualities of composition, rhythm, beauty, and drama in his work.

Robert is the founder of <u>Creative Path Workshops</u> which offers photography and creativity workshops and online training courses from his studio in Beacon, NY. He

has written three books on photography: *Insights Into the Art & Craft of Landscape Photography, Digital Fine Art Printing Field Guide*, and *Insights From the Creative Path*. Robert is also a **Canson Infinity** Ambassador, a select group of hand-picked international artists that uphold and exemplify the Canson heritage of paper making since 1557.

Robert's photography has been widely exhibited, and his images have appeared in many publications including the New York Times. His work is featured extensively by **Scenic Hudson**, a non-profit organization dedicated to conservation in the Hudson Valley region of the US. Robert's web site is **Robert Rodriguez**, **Ir**.





Field Trips

Keep warm in February by visiting the beautiful interior of the National Cathedral, always a popular location.

February 12, 2022 - The National Cathedral (no rain date)

When the sun is low in the winter, it's a great time of year to visit the National Cathedral. It's a literal photographic gold mine. On a sunny day the light creates a dynamic and colorful environment indoors that is unmatched. The National Cathedral also features beautiful and unique Gothic revival architecture outdoors. There are lots of details to discover here and I'm happy to see they have reopened recently after closing for COVID.

Advanced tickets cost \$15 for adults (\$10 for seniors and military). We'll be going — rain, snow, or shine. We're hoping for the best possible weather.

What:

It's been almost 11 years since the earthquake, but repairs continue to the outside of the cathedral. You will likely see scaffolding on the South side of the cathedral and around the top of the center tower. The grounds surrounding the cathedral, including the Bishop's Garden, are freely accessible to explore; however, tickets are required if you want to go in.

Inside you will find the rose windows over the north, south, and west entrances. The north side doesn't get as much light this time of year, but the other sides more than make up for that. The south arcade will be the brightest. The light shining through the stained-glass windows lasts well into the early afternoon and moves from the opposite wall to the floor and then to the adjacent wall. The unique light shining through the stained-glass window near the statue of George Washington (southwest corner of the nave, just to the right as you enter the nave) can't be missed either.

As this is a working church, please be respectful to others who may be there to worship. Aim your camera away from parishioners to respect their privacy. Normally, the cathedral offers a noontime service. If there is a service and you are in the nave, you may be asked to stop taking pictures. This is normal. Try exploring the downstairs, towers, or going outside for the next 30-45 minutes.

Steven Glintz did his first portfolio project on the National Cathedral. He later self-published a much larger body of work, but the portfolio can be seen on our website at NVPS Portfolio Project 2017-2018. Saturday, February 12, 2022 from 10:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. No rain date is scheduled.

We'll meet at 10 a.m. outside the northwest corner of the cathedral near Wisconsin Avenue by the elevator to the underground parking. There is plenty of underground parking for \$9; however, you may find free parking along Wisconsin Avenue.


NVPS members have been busy creating photographic images, submitting them to shows, and getting accepted. Congratulations!


