We are pleased to have speaker Irene Sacilotto bringing us a great program on the island community of Tangier Island.

March 1, 2022 - Irene Sacilotto - *Life in the Chesapeake Bay: Tangier Island, a Visual Journey*

For more than 35 years Irene has shared her photographic experiences and love of nature with thousands of individuals through more than 300 photo classes, workshops, lectures, and tours in both the US and abroad, including Kenya, Iceland, Newfoundland, the Falkland Islands, the Brazilian Pantanal, South Dakota Badlands, Bosque del Apache, Chincoteague National Wildlife Refuge, Tangier Island, etc. Program sponsors have included zoos, nature centers, camera clubs, and conservation organizations such as National Wildlife Federation and the Assateague Island Alliance.

For many years she has taught photography classes at Johns Hopkins University and other educational institutions, and has written "How To" articles on nature photography for national publications, such as *Outdoor Photographer* and *Birding*.

Her images have appeared in magazines, calendars, and books published by National Wildlife Federation, Natural History Society, Audubon, and Sierra Club. Credits include the book *Chincoteague National Wildlife Refuge, an Ecological Treasure.* 

Irene's presentation will explore the Tangier Islands, VA, located just south of the Maryland line in the middle of the Chesapeake Bay. It is

actually a series of small islands connected by narrow bridges spanning marshes and tidal creeks. From the mainland it can only be reached by boat or small plane. On its narrow roads, golf carts and bicycles replace cars as the primary mode of transportation. It is a charming community of shop owners and watermen, with many inhabitants making their living on the water as did their ancestors by oystering and crabbing. Recently Tangier Island has been the focus of news stories as a possible casualty of climate change and sea level rise, as each year flooding on the island

becomes more frequent and erosion increases. This presentation is a visual journey, compiled from photos that Irene has taken over the years. It explores life on Tangier and paints a picture of the island, watermen community, and the wildlife that inhabits its marshes, lagoons, and tidal makeup. It will Include tips on photographing the watermen community and its wildlife. Irene's Facebook page is at Irene Sacilotto.

He has received multiple honors in the *Wildlife Photographer of the Year* competition (including a win in the Black and White category in 2019), multiple commendations in the *Nature's Best/Windland Smith Rice Awards*, and is a two-time winner of the *MalaMala Photographer of the Year* competition. Max's work has appeared in such publications as *Africa Geographic* and *ESPN the Magazine*, and has been displayed at the Smithsonian Museum of Natural History in Washington, DC, and the Natural History Museum in London.

Max leads photo tours in the Pacific Northwest, Yellowstone, and overseas with a heavy emphasis on biodiversity and destinations that offer a variety of subject matter. His website is <u>Max Waugh Photography</u>.



March 8, 2022 - Interim Portfolio Project Review, Group 2



The second half of this year's participants will have their first preliminary review on March 8.

The first preliminary review for the Portfolio Project was a huge success. Half the participants for this season were reviewed by Ginger Werz-Petricka, Brenda Wilson, and Willa Friedman.

As always, it was a pleasure to see the variety of subjects that intrigue our mem-

bers. Personal projects like the Portfolio Project afford every photographer, no matter their experience level, a terrific opportunity to explore a concept in depth. Participants decide on a subject they want to explore, write an Artist Statement, and gather images to support their premise. Without the pressure of competition, the photographer can let their imagination roam freely.

Based on the comments provided by the reviewers, members of Group 1 will make any adjustments to their portfolios that they feel are needed prior to their final review.

The final portfolio project review for Group 1 will be April 12 with Cynthia Keith. The final review for Group 2 will be May 17 with Brian Zwit. Both of these reviewers have offered excellent reviews for the project in years past.

In 2014 David, his wife Cynthia, and their dog Sam moved to Annandale from Leesburg to be closer to work. He was a member of the Loudoun Photo Club for about 5 years and then in 2015 joined Northern

Virginia Photographic Society (NVPS). In 2016 he volunteered to be the Webmaster of the NVPS website.

David is also the organizer of the Virginia Beltway Photography Meetup Group, which has over 2,000 members, and he leads about two field trips a month. The group also does a Photo-A-Day project for the year and a monthly project. The goal is to take photos every day and post the best one to the Meetup site. This is a proven

way to improve your photography. David is an affiliate of Skylum and has done a few of these live edit sessions for the Meetup Group. He has a discount code and affiliate links for Skylum software for interested photographers. While he receives a small commission on the sale, it does not increase the price.

Skylum, a photo editor software company, has released a couple of artificial intelligence (AI) photo editing tools (AI and Neo). During his presentation David will do a live photo editing session using this software with photos submitted by NVPS members. Instructions for uploading .jpg photos by members wishing to participate will be provided separately.

She had a choice of several summer projects—filing, cleaning animal cages, or photographing wildlife in city parks for the NYC schools. She claimed to be able to do photography and came home with a camera. Bob taught her everything she needed to know over the following weekend and her work was published. Bob still claims to have taught her everything she knows.

Willa has taken courses and workshops at Photoworks at Glen Echo, and with Freeman Patterson and Andre

Gallant in New Brunswick, Canada, and Santa Fe Workshop. She has also had extensive courses in Photoshop with Eliot Cohen. She has been a member of NVPS since 2004 and has learned a great deal from the members and speakers. She is currently coordinator for the solo shows at Beanetics or will be when they re-open.

Her work is on display at the Art League Gallery at the Torpedo Factory in Alexandria, VA, and she has an image in the permanent collection of the Joseph Miller Center for Photographic Arts. Willa also has had images published in the Northern Virginia Review and District Lines. She has had solo shows at 1st Stage and Beanetics Coffee Roasters in Annandale and has been a guest artist at Waverly Street Gallery in Bethesda.

"For the past two years because of the pandemic, I have been photographing very close to home. This is an overview of the parks in the vicinity and almost all the pictures were taken in the last two

Kirk Johnson is a seasoned photographer who has been taking digital photos since 2012. A Nikon shooter, Kirk is interested in a variety of subjects that include wildlife (in November 2019 he did a photo shoot in South Africa and Zimbabwe), architecture, travel, street and urban, portrait, black-and-white, floral, and abstract. Kirk uses an array of post-processing tools to create his final product including Photoshop Creative Cloud, Topaz Studio, Photomatix, and PortraitPro Studio.

Kirk has been recognized internationally, nationally, and locally with a variety of photographic awards including six photo creations featured on CBS Sunday Morning (2021 & 2022), 2019 Annual Photography Award (APA) - Honorable Mention for Wildlife category, International Fine Arts Photography Award (FAPA) Nominee Award for Abstract photography, the 2014 Great American Country (GAC) Hunt for Americana Photo United States Southern Region Contest. Finalist, and numerous NVPS monthly and

end-of-year competition awards. Additionally, three of his photographs were juried into the 2020 Mid-Atlantic Photo Visions competition including a People's Choice finalist.


