# **COMPETITION THEMES**

Each year NVPS holds three themed competitions to focus and challenge members. The themes for both the NVPS 2022–2023 and the 2023–2024 calendar years are described below. Keep these themes in mind as you photograph in the coming months. More information about competition themes may be found on the NVPS website.

#### 2023-2024

#### **Natural Sand:**

The image must include natural sand. Natural sand is a granular material composed of finely divided rock or mineral particles, such as silicates and volcanic minerals, as well as coral and biogenic sands—these result in sands that are white, yellow, tan, pink, green, black, and other colors.

Sand can't help but play with wind and water to make beautiful and interesting designs. Sand is also a basic landscape material that might escape notice. From the sand dunes on a wind–swept beach to desert sands, sandcastles, meditation gardens, local parks, children's playgrounds, and sports fields, the possibilities are all around us.

Compositions can be created or found, real or abstract. You may come across natural sand and human—made creations in both obvious places and places you may not consider until you start to look and pay attention. And feel free to create your own composition with sand as a major element!

#### Written Language:

The image should include some element of a written language—using letters, characters, words, or some portion thereof. All the world's written languages are acceptable. Compositions can be created or found, real or abstract—although the language elements must not be abstracted beyond recognition. The language elements must be photographed and not added in post—processing—no captions or layers of added text.

Written language is both impactful and beautiful. We can't help but read it wherever it appears in public spaces—such as on street and shop signs, as well as in our own spaces—such as on books, handwritings, keyboards, labels, etc. The more you look, the more you will see. It draws the eye and may convey more than one meaning depending upon the setting.

Written language can also be visually appealing in terms of its shapes, patterns, curves, and lines, independent of any linguistic meaning—the language elements that you include do not need to be "read" as text. This is your chance to make the written language engaging in new ways!

#### Making the World Go 'Round—Gears, Sprockets and Wheels:

The image should include gears, sprockets, or wheels. Gears, sprockets, and wheels have two things in common—they are round and move in a circular motion. Some we see daily, such as bike and auto wheels, while others are usually hidden from view, such as gears in many watches and clocks. They come in all sizes, from minuscule to gigantic. Some are practical and utilitarian, and some are colorful and fun. They could be in motion or at rest. They could be functional or no longer in service.

#### 2024-2025

#### **Motion:**

This theme tasks us to display motion as the dominant subject of our images. The motion could be of a person or persons, an animal or animals, a moving man—made object, water, or practically anything that is moving. Let your creativity shine through!

#### **Texture:**

Texture is described as the visual or tactile/touchable appearance of something. This theme challenges you to capture a photo with a clearly dominant subject that features texture that can be felt through the presentation of the image.

#### **Self-Portraits:**

As photographers, we always photograph behind the lens, except when we take a "selfie" with our cell phones. Creating self–portraits will move us out in front of our own lens, and beyond the selfie as we turn the camera around to develop our portraiture skills.

No selfies for this theme! Selfies are described as "simple photos that can be easily taken without a lot of planning." True portraits require preparation, planning, and time.

As you create your self–portrait, consider your location, lighting, and composition that will capture a moment that portrays you.

Remember, the photo needs to be taken by you, not someone else pushing the shutter, so get out those remotes, use your camera's timer, say "cheese," and have fun!

# June 11, 2023 Upperville Horse Show 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. (no rain date)

with the exception of the American Civil War, the Great War, World War II, and the recent pandemic, the <a href="Upperville Colt & Horse Show">Upperville Colt & Horse Show</a> has been held every year under the oak trees of Grafton Farm since 1853. Originally established to showcase and improve local breeding stock, today's longest running horse show in America now attracts over 20,000 spectators and is one of the most prestigious in the country.

Our June field trip will take us west on Route 50 to Upperville, VA, where on Sunday, June 11, we will attend the 170th Horses & Horsepower Car Show. The day starts with a car show including antique roadsters, muscle cars, and other cars that will satisfy the exotic motorist and photographer. The car show, however, is only the tip of the iceberg since the afternoon events culminate in the racing of horses around the grand prix track.

Inclement weather may delay the events on the final day of the show. With our club picnic and other events landing on the same weekend, we do not have an alternate day scheduled. If the weather turns sour, we'll send out a notice to cancel the field trip.

Parking is free and so is the show. Reserved seating is available for purchase by contacting info@upperville.com or 540-687-5740.

#### **Equipment:**

- ▶ Bring a standard lens (24-70mm) as you walk about the grounds hunting for subjects.
- Bring your super telephoto (300mm+) to catch the action around the grand prix. A 200mm will get you shots, but you may find yourself cropping later to get that little extra zoom.
- Never leave home without a polarizer.
- No flash photography is permitted at the horse show.
- Weather will be warm and there aren't enough trees to shade you from the afternoon sun. Bring a hat and sunscreen to protect yourself.
- Food trucks and tents will be onsite to accept your money. Porta-potties will also be available.

MAPV's Student, Nature, and Photo Art competitions are happening in 2023 as before. All members of the eight photo clubs that organize MAPV are eligible to enter six Nature and six Photo Art images in the competitions as follows:

**NATURE:** (a total of 6 images may be entered)

- Birds
- Wildlife
- Macro/Close-up/Other
- Water
- Landscapes
- Flora other than macro

## PHOTO ART: (a total of 6 images may be entered)

- Architecture/Agriculture/Industry
- Abstracts/Altered Reality
- People (Includes Documentary and Street Photography)
- Studio Photography (Includes Studio Created Techniques and Still Lifes)
- Sports/Action/Adventure
- Other

Please be sure to read and understand the entry requirements and explanations of the different photography categories as images are sometimes rejected due to technical deficiencies or failure to meet individual category requirements. The rules and other information may be found by clicking on Mid–Atlantic Photo Visions Competitions.

Uploading of images to the 2023 Mid–Atlantic Photo Visions began on August 6. To be eligible to enter images you must be a club member in good standing, i.e., having paid your membership dues by September 1. If you are a new member, please contact Tammy Tideswell at the email for "Mid–Atlantic Photo Visions" at Board Contacts before you submit your images. To make sure you qualify, MAPV will compare our list of paid members against the submissions MAPV receives.
