



Learn his workflow and the reasons why it works for him.

tan's photographic journey started in the 1960s with a hand–me–down Nikkormat. But because of his love for scuba diving and marine tropical reef ecology, his equipment and images became dedicated to underwater nature. By 2010 it was time to hang up the scuba gear and when he joined NVPS, Stan was exposed to a whole new world of land–based photography. Still, nature remained a driving force behind his images. Since joining the club, Stan has "volunteered" for Field Trips (twice), Competitions, and Mentoring and is a past President. For the past decade he has helped lead photo tours in Washington State, Alaska, Yellowstone National Park, New Mexico, and Florida.

Like most NVPS members, Stan has entered countless photo competitions and has had numerous favorite images shot down by judges. It is important to pay attention to detail when taking a photo and processing it. But it is also important to remember the reason why you took the photo and what it was that caught your eye—did you successfully convey that vision to the viewer? Stan's talk will cover thoughts on selecting and processing images that you are considering for entry in competitions. This will include Stan working on some anonymous images taken by club members.

This will be completely anonymous so please consider submitting a RAW out—of—the—camera file that you feel competition worthy. Be sure there are no identifying features on the file and try to submit before October 1. Note that he might not be able to get to all the submitted images.

ancy Galib has been taking photographs for most of her life, but much more so in the past seven or so years. She started out with a Kodak Instamatic camera when she was a teenager, and moved on to a rangefinder, and then an SLR during the film—only era. But digital photography and post—production tools were game changers. It's so much easier to experiment without the expense of getting rolls of film developed. Her photography really took off after a photo trip

to Alaska in the winter of 2017 when she learned about shooting raw files and post–processing with Lightroom and Photoshop. She loves the creativity that it gives her to convey what she feels. Nancy has taken several photography trips since then to places like Yellowstone, the Southwest, and most recently, Botswana. Each trip brings new skills, new ways of seeing the world around her, and new friends.

98% percent of the visitors to Yellowstone never see 98% of the park!

ayne is an ecologist–naturalist, educator, and photographer with a master's degree in education. Over his career, he worked for the Fish and Wildlife Service, the National Park Service, and the Navy Photographic Center. He has spent 45 years in science education in public schools and universities. He has taught a variety of photography classes, led photography tours, and has presented educational nature photography programs in the Mid-Atlantic region, the UK, and Australia. He has

received multiple awards from Natures Best, North American Nature Photography Association (NANPA), and several other photography organizations. His photos have been published in a variety of media and appeared in fine art exhibits as well as stock photography around the globe. His web site is Nature is Wild Photography.

The average visitors spend two days visiting Yellowstone, with all their time on roads connecting them to the big—name features such as Old Faithful, Yellowstone Falls, Mammoth Hot Springs, and some other geyser basin features.

They seldom stop even to view some other features along the way in their rush to get to the next "big thing." They "hike" the board walks around some of the geyser basins but little else in their rush to "see it all." There is so much more to see and do in the world's first national park that is 2.2 million acres of treasures.

Wayne will share some of the "undiscovered gems" that are commonly overlooked. This will be from his perspective as a Yellowstone Ranger and as a photographer, and will include boating, hiking, and even camping or sleeping on your boat docked at the public marina at the largest natural freshwater lake in the country.

# Looking for a Frugal Way to Display Your Portfolio?

f you are at all like me, you want a cost–effective way to display your best photos. Over the years, I have not taken it too seriously; I just used my Flickr account to display my photos, in addition to Instagram and Facebook. I have been a long–time Flickr user and have witnessed the annual cost go up to \$72.99, and it does not display my photos very well. It provided me with a "lazy" way to display my photos. And then I found Adobe Portfolio!

Before I go any further, I want to mention that there is a requirement for using Adobe Portfolio. You are required to

have a subscription plan with Adobe. Another option to create a portfolio website, if you do not have an Adobe subscription, is to use a company called <u>Format</u>. For about \$11 a month, you can create a professional–looking portfolio website that includes a custom domain and an online store. For Adobe Portfolio, the domain name is an extra fee plus there is a way to integrate with Etsy or Shopify.

I first found out about Adobe Portfolio from Scott Kelby by attending one of his classes. Of course, YouTube has several videos on how to create a portfolio with Adobe Portfolio in 20 minutes. However, I do not think any of them do that great of a job. Sometimes, editing the website can be quirky, and following the different templates to design the portfolio website is time—consuming. So, it is never that easy.

If you already have a subscription with Adobe to edit your photos with Photoshop and Lightroom with the Photography Plan then you have access to Adobe Portfolio. I have been paying for the Adobe subscription since first it came out. I have only needed the 20GB plan for \$9.99 a month. For me, it's one of the best deals in photography since they provide regular updates. It includes Adobe Portfolio, and that makes it an even better deal as it is basically "free" since it is included in the subscription. Plus, it offers the ability to create five websites!

Here are some basic steps to get started:

- Step 1—Select a template that defines the layout of the website, navigation, and other attributes.
- ▶ Step 2—Organize your photos into collections in Lightroom Classic (desktop version).
- ▶ Step 3—Sync the collections to Lightroom (cloud version), where they are called Albums.
- ▶ Step 4—Add the Albums to the website via a page to display the photos.

On the Adobe Portfolio website, it is easy to create pages for the About and Contact page. When adding a page to create an About page, there is a header section for the Title. Next, you can add a Text box for the description of what you want folks to know about who you are as a photographer. You can also change the fonts within the page to a variety of Adobe fonts.


The Contact page is fairly simple to add your email address, so when someone wants to contact you, the message is sent to you. I was concerned about being spammed with the contact page, but it is secure. I know a photographer who has had a portfolio site for over seven years and has never had an issue with spam. When you receive an email, it has this sentence: "If you believe this is spam, please avoid clicking links or replying with personal information. Learn more about protecting yourself from scams here."

Long-time NVPS member, Sandi Croan, asked me if I could help her update her photography website, shown below:

I worked with Sandi to create a new website at <u>Sandi Croan Photography</u> with Adobe Portfolio and here is the result:

I also guided her with transferring her website domain name. She was paying \$26 a year to Namecheap. I have been with them since 2007 and they always have coupons. The transferred cost was less than \$12.

A major consideration is that the photos should be scaled down to improve the loading of the images and to save space in the cloud. So, the amount of storage you pay for with the photography plan is 20GB and in Sandi's case, she was only using about a third of the total amount of that 20GBs.

I consulted with ChatGPT for a list of the many features of Adobe Portfolio, like the ability to easily change themes. The more modern themes have navigation on the top compared to the left side of the website. You can easily add social media links to Flickr, YouTube, Instagram, and Facebook.


By default, the website is secured and compliant with modern web standards. No coding is

required to modify the pages, and the images are optimized with large images. Plus, the images are protected from right clicks, which would allow for saving the photo locally. There are basic Search Engine Optimization (SEO) tools to add metadata and keywords. Google Analytics can be integrated to track visitor and website performance.

With Adobe Portfolio, you can add a password so only a certain person or group can view the page. You can also add a password to a gallery so only a client can review and approve the photos.

In summary, as you can see, there are many features to create a portfolio of your images in a clean, good–looking website.

- ► There is free parking for visitors, and it is also a ten—minute ride from the Glenmont Metro station (red line).


