Theme: Motion

he offspring of two photographers, Deborah is convinced an inescapable passion for photography was imprinted on her DNA. Raised on film and in a darkroom, she believes the essence of photography is the art and science of painting with light. Deborah uses her camera as an artist would use a paintbrush and thinks about her work as visual alchemy,—a transformation not of matter into gold but of light, color, and line into art. Multiple exposure and intentional camera movement are essential tools of her alchemy allowing her to challenge reality rather than simply recording what lies in front of her lens. Patience, experimentation, and the benevolence of the photography gods are also integral to her work.

Deborah's work is part of individual and corporate collections, including the Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center. She has been exhibited across the US and internationally at New York's Soho Photo Gallery, the Sohn and Cousen Rose galleries in Massachusetts, and at the Horsebridge Arts Centre in Whitstable, Kent, among others.

Deborah serves as a judge and speaker at camera clubs nationwide and teaches a range of photography courses via Zoom. She is also a regular contributor to Everett Potter's Travel Report, where she chronicles her global adventures in words and images. 

Fireworks and Old Town at Night

5:15 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. (rain date December 15)

ould you like to enjoy shooting fireworks without fighting crowds or heat? This field trip will give you that opportunity. Every Saturday through the end of the year there is a fireworks show at National Harbor. The show, which begins at 5:30 p.m., lasts 5-10 minutes and will give all levels of fireworks photographers a chance to get shots of the fireworks with the Capital Wheel and National Harbor in the background. We will photograph the fireworks from across the river at Jones Point Park. After the show is over, we will drive a mile up the road and meet at the northwest corner of King and South Fairfax Streets, where we'll start our walk to photograph Old Town at night, which will be decked out for the holidays.

When:

- ▶ Saturday, December 14, from 5:10 p.m.—8:00 p.m.
- ▶ Rain date December 15, from 6:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. (no fireworks)

Equipment and Notes:

► For the fireworks, a 24-70mm, a 28-300mm, or a similar lens will work well. (No wide angle is needed given the distance we will be from the fireworks). Either will also work for the Old Town shots unless you want to shoot handheld, in which case you should bring a prime lens with good glass. Parking is free and there is no admission fee at this end of the park.

- ▶ Tripods are necessary for the fireworks and encouraged for Old Town.
- ▶ Restrooms are available at Jones Point Park.

- ▶ Jones Point Park Jones Point Drive, Alexandria, VA (free parking: park as close to the water as possible; we will meet at the fishing pier visible from path underneath the Wilson Bridge next to the water's edge)
- Old Town Alexandria (park at the Market Square garage at 108 N. Fairfax Street—\$5 weekend flat fee—and walk out to the corner of King and S. Fairfax Streets; we will meet there)

The first in–person Mid–Atlantic Photo Visions (MAPV) Expo in five years was held on November 2–3 at the Hylton Performing Arts Center in Manassas, VA. MAPV 2024 featured 20 presentations headlined by Michelle Valberg as the keynote speaker, hands–on workshops, photo shoots, image reviews, and one–on–one sessions.

Additionally, there were great deals to be had with all of the vendors that were there, along with the vendors being able to display and answer questions about their gear. This hands—on interaction with the vendors was invaluable.

Fifteen of the presentations were recorded and made available by email to those that purchased the "All—Presentations Pass."

The gallery of almost 500 images was a big draw to those attending the Expo and NVPS was very well represented with 151 images by 39 of our photographers. Nine of the Nature images and five of the Photo Art images of
