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

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MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

January brings us to into the second half of our club year. We have so much to look forward to at NVPS: Portfolio Project reviews, more Program speakers, continued Education and Training opportunities, Competitions, and rich Member's Galleries and Forums, all to inspire and motivate us.

January also brings us to a time to reflect on NVPS as a community of photographers, in this club year and beyond to our future. Prior to the pandemic shutdown, per the NVPS Constitution, Bylaws, and Rules of Competition, all meetings were held in person at the firehall. Each competition included prints and digital. Members were allowed to enter two prints or one print and one digital. There was a two—year time limitation on submissions.

When we moved to all–virtual zoom meetings in 2020, the board developed temporary rules with competitions moving to all digital, with separate color and monochrome submission categories. The time limitation was expanded to three years as opportunities for making photos was limited.

As we emerged from the shutdown, the board continued with temporary meeting and rule changes, moving to some in–person meetings and returning to some print competitions.

To our credit, our club adapted quickly to the pandemic circumstances, and I believe we are now at a point where we can update our meeting plan for NVPS and no longer require temporary rules for meetings and competition.

In the new year, we will have the opportunity to discuss and reflect on how we move forward. I believe it is important to update our permanent rules and meeting norms that are inclusive of all aspects of the club's activities: continuing to offer in–person and virtual meetings, as well as print and digital competitions. NVPS has demonstrated the ability to welcome members who may only be able to participate online, some may prefer in person, some may like to make prints, others may prefer only digital image making. We are not an either/or club: what makes us a great club is welcoming each member where they are.

I am excited for this time at NVPS, and I am so very grateful for each of you, who make our club a rich environment for learning and developing as photographers. As Karl Lagerfeld's quote infers, NVPS pre—pandemic was a moment that is now gone—and it is time for us to look to our future and embrace our new ways of engaging with each other and our photography.

Each element in the photograph works together to evoke a sense of story, inviting the viewer to interpret and engage with the subject's experiences or emotions.

In her presentation, Catherine will share insights from her experiences photographing a diverse range of individuals, illustrating how to achieve exceptional results through a step—by—step approach. A key focus will be on the strategic use of props—such as vintage accessories, musical instruments, or personal artifacts—to add depth and context to portraits, thereby enriching the storytelling aspect of the images.

or over 25 years Mary Louise Ravese has specialized in outdoor photography from locations across the US and the world. Her artistic vision and photographic style are things that are continually evolving. Her favorite subjects are country landscapes, nature closeups, interesting architectural details, and abstracts. When composing, she looks for distinctive shapes, unique textures, and intriguing juxtapositions of color and tone.

In recent years she has become fascinated with the idea of blurring the line between the look of traditional photographic realism and the look of other fine art mediums. She has been exploring making very creative images of unique subjects which

are often overlooked. Ideally, Mary wants to achieve the look she wants in—camera as much as possible. Ultimately, she feels that her most successful photographs are those that are not just technically good, but those that capture a moment of beauty or drama—images that evoke an emotional response in the viewer.

She studied photography through the University of California Berkeley and Santa Cruz extension programs, as well as the Washington School of Photography. Over the years she has had a number of photography mentors who have guided and influenced her including Barbara Brundege, Jean-Louis Martinetti, and Harold "Doc" Edgerton. She is a member of the North American Nature Photography Association and the Carolinas' Nature Photographers Association. While Mary has lived in a variety of states and countries, currently she calls North Carolina home. She supports her local arts community as an artist member of 311 Gallery and Artspace in Raleigh, the Durham Art Guild in Durham, and the Piedmont Craftsmen Guild in Winston—Salem. It soon became a hub for the east coast whaling industry. In 1761, it became the first seashore resort in our country. After a fire swept through the town in the late 1800's, new buildings were constructed in the "modern" Victorian Style. It is those homes that are the center of this presentation. Preservation efforts have allowed Cape May to retain much of the architecture constructed during that time which has resulted in its present—day charm.

Get to Know the Photographic Society of America

s the editor of FotoFax, I am the NVPS representative to the Photographic Society of America (PSA). Even though NVPS has been a club member of PSA for many years, I had no idea about my role as the club rep nor what the role and mission was for PSA. You might notice that in every issue of FotoFax I save the last page for information and links for PSA (see page 32 in this issue).

I do not know how many of our club members belong to PSA or are familiar with its activities, opportunities, or what it might offer to you should you choose to join.

According to their web site, the Photographic Society of America is one of the largest non–profit organizations for photographers and photographic organizations. Established in 1934, it has members in over 60 countries.

PSA (headquartered in Oklahoma City) offers inter–club photo competitions, individual photo competitions, individual certifications, star ratings, recognition of photographic achievement (based on star ratings), and portfolio distinctions. I was very pleased to accept the Honorable Mention in Magazine Style Newsletters for FotoFax this year as part of the interclub newsletter competitions.



Their educational opportunities include online courses, study groups, members, and consultants, and webinars.

If you enjoy entering photo competitions on a variety of themes, you should check them out.

Internationally they sponsor gallery shows and meetings, the last of which was in July in Java, Indonesia, which had 222 photographers in attendance from 22 countries. Their 85th national Photo Gathering is scheduled for September, 2025, in Tucson, AZ.

Activities for members include:

- ► Educational opportunities include Online Courses, Webinars, Mentors, Consultants, and Study Groups
- A Monthly Journal, online or print copy
- Six Divisions specializing in distinct photographic areas
- Quarterly Division Newsletters
- Competitions for members and club members
- Opportunities for members to volunteer

I'd suggest that you look at their website to see all of the opportunities that are available from PSA as an individual member (cost \$65 per year). And if you are a current individual member of PSA, let me know because I'd like to talk to you about your experiences.

In order for NVPS to participate in some of the club competitions, we would need a volunteer to coordinate entries and participation on behalf of our club. Please talk to me if you are interested.



JANUARY 25 (IN PERSON)

US Botanic Garden

9:45 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. (rain date January 26)

n January, NVPS will visit the tropical conditions inside the US Botanic Garden located at the foot of Capitol Hill on Independence Ave. Exhibits at the Botanic Garden range from roses to orchids, the rain forest of the Mid–Atlantic, endangered plants, and the latest in home gardening. The indoor galleries display flora of the jungle, desert, and primeval settings. This diversity of form and color will provide outstanding photographic opportunities. Admission is free.

The Botanic Garden has a <u>photographic policy</u> which prohibits the use of tripods unless you have a permit. There are a limited number of tripod permits available. If you plan to use one, you must get prior approval by contacting Victoria Gesell at <u>victoria.gesell@aoc.gov</u>. Permit reservations must be requested at least one week in advance. Permits on the day of our trip may not be available, but check with the visitor's desk for approval.

We will meet at the Garden entrance at the opening time of 9:45 a.m. for a short meet—and—greet before the Garden opens at 10:00 a.m. We'll take images of the plants and scenery inside the Garden for a couple of hours and then take a break. Across the street at the Smithsonian American Indian Museum is the Mitsitam Native Foods Café. We'll meet there at 12:30 p.m. for some coffee and snacks.

Equipment and Notes:

- ▶ Bring your favorite close—up or macro lens. A 24—70mm will also be useful for indoor shots. Be mindful that the Garden is a popular destination in the winter so bring your patience as well.
- ► The Garden maintains high humidity in some areas and mists the plants with water. This leaves the plants wet and shiny. You can cut the shine and pop the colors if you remember to bring your polarizer. ipods are allowed, but caution is recommended.
- ▶ Be mindful when transitioning between exhibits. Bring your microfiber cloth or official NVPS Spudz to help keep your lens free of fog.
- Use of a tripod requires a permit. See information above on how to obtain a permit.

Where:

- ▶ We'll meet at 9:45 a.m. outside the Garden's entrance facing the Mall/Maryland Ave. SW.
- ▶ The US Botanic Garden does not have any official parking available. Parking on Maryland Avenue, SW, is restricted, especially if Congress is in session. You will find metered street parking in the area, including across Independence Ave. The Metro is a great alternative. The Orange, Blue, and Silver lines will all take you to Federal Center SW, which is a two-block walk on Third Street NW, south of the Garden.



For 2025, we are back and prepared to hold a virtual exhibit. We have revamped the entry and exhibit spaces and expect to hold an exceptional exhibit.

The preceding exhibits played a major role in the popularity of abstract photography, not only in the Northern Virginia area, but in the larger photographic community. Joseph Miller's outstanding reputation attracted entries from international and national photographers. We strive to continue that tradition.

New in 2025 is the addition of cash prizes for Special Merit, Best in Show, and Peoples' Choice awards.

The Joseph Miller Center will accept entries for the 14th Annual Joseph Miller Abstract Photography Exhibit beginning on Monday, December 30, 2024.

The deadline for submissions will be Sunday, March 16, 2025.

We will post a detailed Prospectus containing all relevant information for the exhibit on the <u>Northern Virginia</u> Alliance of Camera Clubs (NVACC) website.
