He is now an award-winning, internationally-recognized photographer and instructor, having taught on four continents and in over 20 countries. David teaches and mentors photographers, models, and makeup artists. His personal mentoring programs for photographers and commercial models continue to grow in popularity.

Her Story—Through the Lens—A Journey Into Women's Beauty, Power, and Spirit

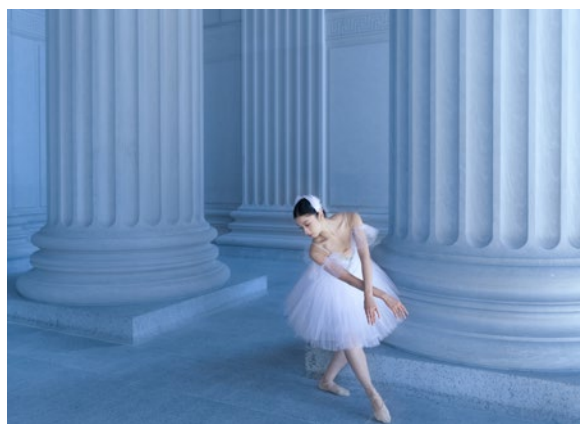

Birds of the World

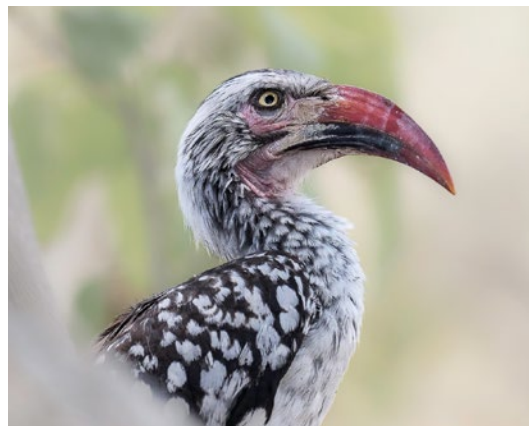

Jim & Jerri McDermott

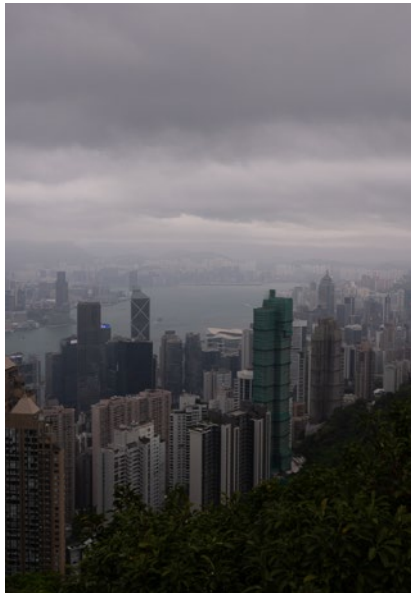
Japan (and Hong Kong and Taipei) by Boat

Having lucked into a repositioning cruise deal, Jerri and Jim McDermott traveled to Hong Kong, Taipei, and along the coast of Japan in 2025. Repositioning happens when cruise lines move ships from sailing in one geographic region to another. The cruises are sometimes less expensive than “normal” cruises and are generally less frequent but may not offer the same range of shore excursions. Jerri and Jim will share some photographs from the trip, as well as observations on doing photography on a cruise, particularly a repositioning cruise.

Jerri and Jim McDermott have been active members of NVPS for over 10 years. Jerri was a librarian in the Fairfax County schools, and Jim was an economist in the federal government. Both credit their friends at NVPS with encouraging their learning and development as photographers. They’ve both migrated to using mirrorless Nikon cameras.

B&O Railroad Museum

10:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. (rain date January 31)

We're starting the new year with a visit to one of the most iconic rail history destinations in the country: the B&O Railroad Museum in Baltimore. Housed in the historic 1884 Roundhouse, the museum features beautifully restored locomotives, vintage railcars, historic platforms, and industrial-era details that make for outstanding photographic opportunities. From sweeping architectural lines to intricate mechanical textures, this location offers something for every photographer—whether you enjoy wide-angle compositions, detail studies, or documentary-style storytelling.

The museum's indoor exhibits make this an excellent winter field trip, and the outdoor rail yard provides additional opportunities if the weather cooperates.

When:

- ▶ Saturday, January 24, 2026, from 10:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. (rain date is January 31)
- ▶ We will meet inside the main entrance lobby at 10:00 a.m. for a brief welcome before exploring the exhibits.

Where:

- ▶ B&O Railroad Museum
901 West Pratt Street
Baltimore, MD 21223
- ▶ Parking is free in the museum's main lot located next to the entrance. Entrance to the Museum grounds is located at the intersection of West Pratt Street and Poppleton Street.

Cost:

- ▶ General admission is \$20 for adults and \$17 for seniors (60+). Tickets may be purchased online in advance or at the door.

Suggested Gear and Notes:

- ▶ A standard zoom (24–70mm) will work well for most scenes
- ▶ A wide-angle lens is helpful for capturing the Roundhouse interior
- ▶ A telephoto lens can be useful for isolating details on locomotives and railcars
- ▶ Tripods are permitted except in areas where they may block walkways—please follow any posted guidelines or staff instructions
- ▶ The museum is mostly indoors, but dress warmly if you plan to photograph in the outdoor rail yard
- ▶ Restrooms, a café, and a gift shop are available on site

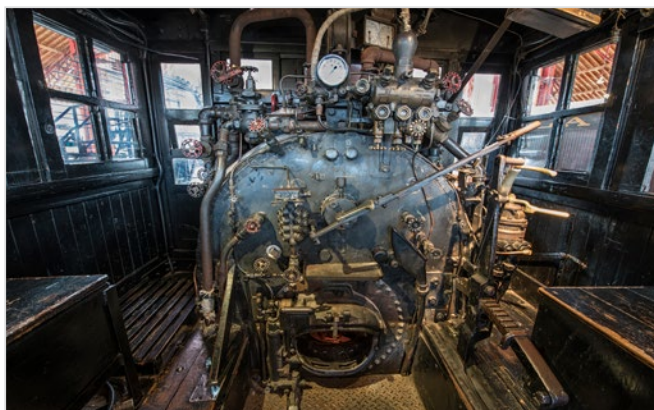

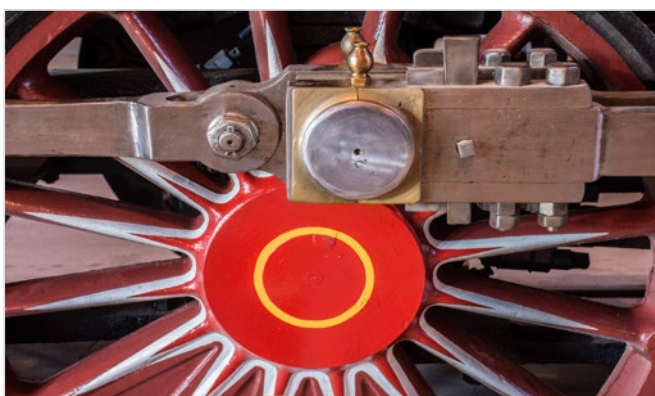

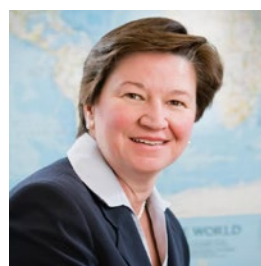
