
Visual Design Principles in Composition and in the Creative Process Building Blocks Primary Elements of Design - Tone and Color


Tone - Degree of Intensity of Light Reveals shape/texture

Color - Affects Mood/Emotion

Warm colors "advance" (Yellow, Red, Orange) Cool colors recede (Green, Blue)

Zone System Grayscale Chart





Primary Colors: Red, Yellow and Blue Secondary Colors: Orange, Green and Violet

Secondary Compositional Elements

Line (Light) Shape Texture (Light) Perspective (Lens, angle)

<u>Line</u> Horizontal - calming Vertical - power Oblique - motion/dynamic...

<u>Shape</u>

Square/rectangle Circle/Oval Triangle

<u>Texture</u>

In the visual arts, texture is the perceived surface quality. It is an element of two-dimensional and threedimensional design and is distinguished by its perceived visual and physical properties. Use of texture, along with other elements of design, can convey a variety of messages and emotions.

Perspective

The technique used to represent a three-dimensional world (what we see) on a two-dimensional surface (a print) in a way that looks realistic and accurate, as we see it. It is used to create an illusion of space and depth on a flat surface. Appearing to enlarge or extend the actual space, or to give the effect of distance.



Rule of Thirds
































































































































































































































































































